BASIC CONDITIONS STATEMENT FOR THE BROSELEY NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN AS REQUIRED AT REGULATION 15

1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This Basic Conditions Statement has been produced to explain how the Broseley Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) and also referred to as the Plan, has been prepared in accordance with the Neighbourhood Planning General Regulations 2015 and how the Basic Conditions of neighbourhood planning and other considerations as prescribed by paragraph 8(2) of schedule 4B to the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 have been considered to have been met.
- 1.2 The Statement addresses each of the Basic Conditions required by the Regulations and explains how the submitted NDP meets the requirements of paragraph 8(2) of schedule 4B to the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- 1.3 The Regulations state that a Neighbourhood Plan will be considered to have met the Basic Conditions if:
- * Having regard to national policies and advice issued by the Secretary of State it is appropriate to make the Neighbourhood Plan,
- * The making of the Neighbourhood Plan contributes to the achievement of sustainable development,
- * The making of the Neighbourhood Plan is in general conformity with the strategic policies contained in the Development Plan for the area of the authority (or any part of that area),
- * The making of the Neighbourhood Plan does not breach and is otherwise compatible with EU obligations

(as adopted by the UK government under the Environmental assessment of Plans and programmes Regulations 2004)

Supporting Documents and Evidence

1.4 The Neighbourhood Plan is supported by this Basic Conditions Statement, a Consultation Statement, a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Screening Statement, a Habitat Regulation (HRA) Screening Report prepared by Shropshire Council, an application for the designation of the NDP boundary and evidence gathered during consultation and early engagement. The evidence gathered together with supporting documents is included the Neighbourhood Plan first approved by Broseley Town Council on 10th. March 2020, with this Section 15 version approved by BTC on April 29th 2021.

Key Statements

1.5 Broseley Town Council is a qualifying body and entitled to submit a Neighbourhood Plan for its own administrative area.

- 1.6 The Neighbourhood Plan includes the whole of the administrative are of Broseley Town Council, the boundaries being the same as shown on the map accompanying the Neighbourhood Area designation application.
- 1.7 The Broseley Neighbourhood Development Plan covers the period 2020 to 2038 in conformity with the Shropshire adopted Core strategy March 2011 and the adopted Shropshire Site Allocations and Management of Development Plan (SAMDev) December 2015 and the emerging Shropshire Local Plan Review 2016 to 2038.
- 1.8 The NDP does not relate to more than one Neighbourhood Area. It is solely related to the administrative area of Broseley Town Council as designated by Shropshire Council on $17^{\rm th}$. September 2018.

2.0 CONFORMITY WITH NATIONAL PLANNING POLICY

- 2.1 The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) refers to Neighbourhood Plans in sections 2, 3, 5, 8, 12 and 13 and seeks that those plans have regard to the policies in the NPPF and to be in general conformity with the strategic policies of the Local Plan. This phrasing is explained more clearly by the Localism Act, which refers to "the adopted development plan". The Broseley NDP was developed under the 2018, and 2019 versions of the NPPF, with paragraph references in this Statement updated to match the changes in the 2021 version of the NPPF.
- 2.2 This section of the Basic Conditions Statement demonstrates that the NDP has regard to the relevant policies in the NPPF in relation to:
 - a) Achieving Sustainable Development
 - b) Delivering a sufficient supply of homes
 - c) Building a strong and competitive economy
 - d) Ensuring the vitality of town centres
 - e) Promoting healthy and safe communities
 - f) Promoting sustainable transport
 - g) Supporting high quality communications
 - h)Making effective use of land Achieving well designed places
 - i) Protecting Green Belt land
 - i) Meeting the challenge of climate change, flooding and coastal change
 - k) Conserving the natural environment
 - l) Conserving the historic environment
 - m) Facilitation the sustainable use of minerals
- 2.3 The Broseley Plan has ten policy objectives that form the basis for the planning policies set out in the Plan. The objectives focus on:

- a) Housing
- b) Employment and jobs
- c) Green spaces and green infrastructure
- d) Traffic and accessibility
- e) Conservation and heritage
- f) Community resources
- g) Sport leisure and recreation
- h) Supporting the visitor economy
- I) Sustainable development and climate change

3.0 MAKING A CONTRIBUTION TO ACHIEVING SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

- 3.1 The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) states that the purpose of the planning system is to contribute to the achievement of sustainable development. Achieving sustainable development means that the planning system has three overarching objectives. These are:
 - a) An economic objective
 - b) A social objective
 - c) An environmental objective

<u>Table 3 below summarizes how the Broseley Neighbourhood Development Plan contributes towards these objectives.</u>

Comments: The NDP supports the provision of new local jobs, local investment and innovation in business and local renewable energy projects together with supporting the viability of Broseley centre.

Delivering the Social Objective

NDP Policies: A1, DS1-DS10, HO1-7 and CR1-2 and GR1-7

- a) Supporting the provision of new housing to meet local needs
- b) Supporting high quality place led design
- c) Protecting existing community resources and supporting the provision of new facilities
- d) Protecting public open spaces
- e) Supporting the provision of accessible green space, sport and recreation

Comments: The NDP seeks to maintain a thriving community with the provision of new housing to meet local needs with a range of community facilities and local services, employment opportunities and accessible green spaces, sport and recreation.

Delivering the Environmental Objective

NDP Policies: A1, DS1-10, HO1-7, GR1-7, VE1-4, SD1-4, CH1-2 and WA1

Comments: The NDP recognizes the value of local green spaces. The protection of local biodiversity and the value of environmental assets for local health and well-being are also recognized. The NDP places emphasis on providing accessible pedestrian and cycle routes throughout Broseley. The NDP supports energy efficient development and local initiatives in renewable energy as a contribution to sustainable development and meeting the challenge of climate change. The NDP seeks to conserve the historic environment.

3.2 The above table demonstrates that the Broseley NDP provides a balance of economic, social and environmental policies that conform to the requirements of the NPPF. A Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) was not required (screened-out) because the Plan is not likely to have a significant impact on the environment and was therefore screened-out.

4.0 GENERAL CONFORMITY WITH THE POLICIES OF THE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

4.1 It is a requirement of the Basic Conditions that the Neighbourhood Development plan must be in general conformity with the strategic policies in any Development Plan that covers their area. The Development Plan for the Broseley Neighbourhood Area comprises the adopted Shropshire Core Strategy 2011, the adopted Shropshire Site Allocations and Management of Development Plan (SAMDev) 2015 and the emerging Shropshire Local Plan Review 2016-2038. The Broseley NDP has been prepared in conformity with these Plans and is therefore in conformity with the strategic policies in the Development Plan for its area. Any development plan policies that are not listed in the table below are

not considered relevant to the NDP because the Broseley Plan does not have any policies that directly relate to them.

Although a draft Neighbourhood Plan is not tested against an emerging Local Plan the reasoning and evidence informing the Local Plan is likely to be relevant to the consideration of the Basic Conditions against which the Neighbourhood Plan is tested.

4.2 The above tables and assessment confirm that the Broseley Neighbourhood Development Plan has regard to national policy and advice and it is in general conformity with the strategic policies of the Development Plan for Shropshire (made up of the adopted Core Strategy 2011, the adopted Site Allocations and Management of Development Plan (SAMDev) 2015 and the emerging Local Pan Review 2016-2038). It can also be concluded from this assessment that the Broseley Neighbourhood Development Plan makes a contribution to the achievement of sustainable development as required in order to meet the Basic Conditions.

5.0 THE BROSELEY NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN DOES NOT BREACH AND IS COMPATIBLE WITH EU OBLIGATIONS (AS ADOPTED BY THE UK GOVERNMENT UNDER THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT OF PLANS AND PROGRAMMES REGULATIONS 2004) AND HUMAN RIGHTS REQUIREMENTS

5.1 The Broseley NDP has regard to the fundamental rights and freedoms guaranteed under the European Convention on Human Rights and complies with the Human Rights Act.

5.2 In addition to this Basic Conditions Statement the Broseley Town Council has prepared a Consultation Statement, a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Screening Statement and a Habitat Regulations Assessment (HRA) Screening Statement. All of these documents have been published together with the Regulation 15 Submission Plan and may be viewed at the Town Council website and the Shropshire Council website.

5.3 Based on the Screening Statements the Town Council considers that the NDP does not require a Strategic Environmental Assessment under the SEA Directive and the Environmental assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2010 (as amended). This is because there will be no significant environmental effects arising from the implementation of the NDP and the Plan is therefore screened-out of the SEA process. The NDP has been similarly screened under the Habitat Regulations Assessment (HRA) process and the Town Council has adopted infrastructure policies to take account of the matters raised.

5.4 Therefore, in accordance with Regulation 9 of the Strategic Environmental Appraisal Regulations 2004, the Town Council as the responsible body has determined that an Environmental Assessment (SEA) of the Broseley Neighbourhood Development Plan is not required as the Plan is unlikely to have significant environmental effects.

6.0 CONCLUSION

6.1 The Basic Conditions as set out in Schedule 4B to the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 are considered to be met by the Broseley Neighbourhood Development Plan and all the policies therein. The Town Council therefore considers that the Broseley NDP complies with Paragraph 8(1)(a) of Schedule 4B of the Act.
